# **Inauguration of Chemical Sciences building by HRD Minister**

The new Chemical Sciences building at IISc was inaugurated by the Honourable Minister for Human Resource Development, Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank, on October 10, 2019. The building, with an area of 2.75 lakh sq. ft., is a framed structure with a ground floor and three upper floors, and houses laboratories, faculty rooms, an auditorium and classrooms. The Minister took a tour of the building and interacted with students in the laboratories.
